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WHAT IS PANHELLENIC?

Panhellenic is the governing body for the four National Panhellenic Conference sororities here at Knox College: Alpha Sigma Alpha, Delta Delta, Kappa Kappa Gamma, and Pi Beta Phi.

The Knox College Panhellenic Council meets weekly to discuss upcoming chapter events, programs, and community concerns. FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

DO I NEED TO ATTEND EVERY RECRUITMENT EVENT?

No, you do not have to attend every recruitment event. However, it's highly encouraged to attend as many as you can to get a full experience and learn about the different sororities. Attending a variety of events will help you make an informed decision about where you feel most comfortable and where you'll fit best.

DO I HAVE TO BE A FIRST-YEAR TO PARTICIPATE?

No, transfer and current undergraduate students are welcome!

WHAT SHOULD I WEAR TO RECRUITMENT EVENTS?

There is no specific dress code for recruitment events, so wear whatever you feel most comfortable in! The way you dress will not impact your bid, so focus on wearing something that makes you feel confident and at ease.

IF I GO THROUGH RECRUITMENT, AM I OBLIGATED TO JOIN A SORORITY?

No, you are not! Please read through the MRABA section for more details on what this means for your future eligibility, but you are free to decline a bid/drop the recruitment process at any point in time, for any reason.

HOW MUCH DOES IT COST TO BE IN A SORORITY?

The cost of dues will vary between chapters. In each chapters' section, more specific information on finances is offered.

WHAT TYPES OF EVENTS WILL I ATTEND DURING RECRUITMENT?

Recruitment typically includes a variety of events, such as meet-and-greets, information sessions, house tours, and more. Some events may include casual mixers, while others may focus on conversations or activities to get to know members.

WHY DO YOU USE THE TERM "SIBLINGS" INSTEAD OF "SISTERS" IN SORORITY LIFE AT KNOX COLLEGE?

At Knox College, the term "siblings" is used in sorority life to emphasize inclusivity and equality. It reflects a commitment to creating a more gender-neutral and supportive environment where all members are viewed as equal, regardless of gender. It focuses on the shared bond of membership and sorority life, rather than gender-based distinctions. It's a way of modernizing language and promoting a more inclusive atmosphere.

FINANCIAL INFORMATION

Sororities do come with a financial commitment. Generally, finances are paid out in the form of what we call 'dues', which are termly charges that will pay for chapter operations, and may include merchandise, social events, and philanthropies.

Every sorority has a different cost of dues. Generally, one-time fees such as badge fees will make your first term slightly more expensive.

Full financial transparency will be provided in each chapters' section and during orientation, but the cost of the first term can range from \$245 to \$654. All sororities also offer payment plans, where you will able to pay your dues in installments — all at once, weekly, biweekly, etc. — depending on your financial needs.







TERMS

Philanthropy

Fund-raising projects sponsored by fraternities or sororities supporting local and inter/national charitable organizations. Note: this is different from community service.

Panhellenic Council

The governing body for all National Panhellenic Conference sororities on campus.

New Member Education Period

The period before initiation when new members learn about their sorority.

CPA

College Panhellenic Association, also known as Panhellenic Council.

Active/Active Member

A member of a fraternity or sorority who has been initiated and is currently in college.

Chapter

A chartered undergraduate or alumni group that is recognized by the national and inter-fraternity or sorority.

Continuous Recruitment (CR)

A formal recruitment process that occurs during the primary recruitment period, providing sororities an opportunity to engage potential new members in a structured yet flexible way, similar to Continuous Open Bidding (COB).

Continuous Open Bidding (COB)

An informal recruitment process sororities use to invite and extend bids to potential new members outside the formal recruitment period, typically for potential members that are looking for a less structured recruitment style.

Legacy

Someone whose family member holds or has previously held membership in a sorority. This can be your sibling, parent, etc.

Sibling

A term used within sororities when referring to other members.

Potential New Member (PNM)

A person participating in recruitment.

New Member

A potential new member who has accepted a sorority bid, but has yet to be initiated.

Initiation

The formal ritual that brings new members into full membership of the sorority or fraternity. Through initiation, members learn and commit themselves to upholding the ideals of the sorority or fraternity.

Big

An older member assigned to assist a new member in their college transition.

Bid

A formal invitation to join a sorority or fraternity, given at the end of the recruitment period.

Alumna/Alumnae/Alum

An initiated member of a sorority who has received their undergraduate degree.

Letters

All Greek organizations are represented in Greek letters. Members' affiliations can be identified by the greek letters they wear.

Chapter Meetings

Sorority chapter meetings are regularly scheduled gatherings where members of a sorority come together to discuss organizational business, plan events, share updates, and address community or chapter-related matters in accordance with their bylaws and policies.

Friday, January 24th are Invite-Only Rounds. If invited by a chapter, you will receive an email and/or Engage RSVP! You may be invited to multiple one-hour rounds, where each will consist of different rituals and traditions.

Saturday, January 25th is Bid Day! If you receive a Bid from a chapter, you will receive an email with more information about where to be and when!


Throughout Winter term, chapters will host multiple recruitment events. These could range from large group activities to one-on-one coffee dates! Recruitment is flexible, and we want to work with your schedule. If you can't find an event that works for you, reach out to the chapter's Panhellenic representative!



- The College Panhellenic has information available that tells you what to expect during recruitment.
- You should ask questions when you do not understand.
- Some events will have more potential new members in attendance than others, and this is no reflection on a chapter.
- Being a legacy of an organization does not ensure membership in that chapter.
- Panhellenic sororities recognize the importance of scholarship, and therefore each has a minimum GPA requirement to be a member of the chapter.
- Knox College and all NPC organizations have policies against hazing.
- No chapter member may promise or imply the promise of a bid.
- You are expected to act respectfully when attending recruitment events.
- You should expect to be treated with respect.
- You must be certain you understand the Membership Recruitment Acceptance Binding Agreement (MRABA) that you will be expected to sign after accepting a bid.
- You may choose not to join an organization and therefore not sign the MRABA.
- Male-identifying people and alcohol are not permitted during recruitment or Bid Day activities.

PNM BILL OF RIGHTS

- The right to be treated as an individual.
- The right to be fully informed about the recruitment process.
- The right to ask questions and receive true and objective answers from members.
- The right to be treated with respect.
- The right to be treated as a capable and mature person without being patronized.
- The right to ask how and why and receive straight answers.
- The right to have and express opinions.
- The right to make informed choices without undue pressure from others.
- The right to be fully informed about the NPC Unanimous Agreements implicit in the Membership Recruitment Acceptance Binding Agreement (MRABA) signing process.
- The right to make one's own choice and decision and accept full responsibility for the results of that decision.
- The right to have a positive, safe, and enriching recruitment and new member experience.





GPA RELEASE & ANTI-HAZING FORM

This form provides authorization from the student to waive their FERPA rights so the following information related to the student may be shared with the Campus Life Office, who in turn may share all such information with a chapter's leadership and other local and national chapter representatives.

This authorization will continue for as long as the student is a member of the indicated chapter. Chapters use this information to confirm GPA requirements and provide academic and behavior support and best practices as needed. Information that may be shared includes:

- Grade point average (term and cumulative)
- Midterm grades
- Term credits
- Term hours
- Enrollment status
- Disciplinary probation status and related information



This form also explains the Anti-Hazing Policy of Knox College, an overview of hazing, and resources available related to hazing.

This form must be signed by any student interested in joining a social fraternity or sorority chapter at Knox College, including Order of Omega. This form must be filled out by a potential new member before a bid can be extended. A student is not considered by Knox College to be eligible for membership of one of the chapters unless this form is signed.

MRABA

The Membership Recruitment Acceptance Binding Agreement (MRABA) is a document that you will sign after receiving a bid from a sorority that you would like to accept. Signing this document means that you are willing to accept the bid from indicated sorority.

Until you sign the MRABA, you are able to drop out of the recruitment process at any time, for any reason, without repercussions. If you receive a bid, sign the MRABA, and then choose to drop out, you will not be eligible to join a sorority until next Winter Recruitment in 2026. This means you will not be able to receive a bid from another sorority through COB or spring/fall recruitment.

Please read this document carefully. You should not sign this binding agreement unless you understand it. You will need a witness signature from a member of the chapter or college advisor in order to submit it. Members accepting a bid will sign the MRABA on Bid Day.







ANTI-HAZING POLICIES

Hazing includes any action that endangers mental or physical health, causes ridicule, embarrassment, harassment, or violates personal or moral beliefs as part of initiation or membership in a group. Examples include:

- Physical Harm: Paddling, assault, forced consumption of substances.
- Psychological Harm: Verbal abuse, degrading acts, sleep deprivation.
- Humiliation: Public stunts, extra chores, name-calling.

Hazing is prohibited regardless of consent or apathy. Initiations must avoid harm, prioritize academics, and receive prior approval if conducted outside of chapter houses.

Bid promising occurs when a sorority member implies or explicitly guarantees a bid before formal recruitment concludes. This undermines fairness, creates undue pressure, and sets false expectations for potential new members. Any instance of bid promising should be reported immediately.
